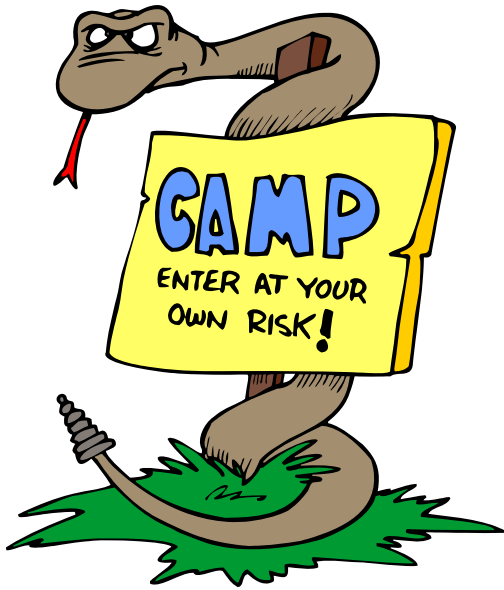


# 2009 Cub Scout Day Camp

**CAMPERS AT THE SAUK VILLAGE SITE WILL HAVE THURSDAY'S PROGRAM ON FRIDAY**

**AND REGULAR HOURS ON THURSDAY**

- **LATE ARRIVAL AND EARLY DEPARTURE**

Campers that arrive late must check in at the camp office before joining their group. Campers leaving early must check out at the camp office before leaving.

- **VISITORS**

Visitors are welcome but they must register at the camp office upon arrival and check out upon departure.

- **CAMP UNIFORM**

Day camp will provide a T-shirt to your scout. T-shirts are part of our security and must be worn everyday. If your son returns to camp without his shirt, you will be charged for another shirt.

- **INCLEMENT WEATHER**

Day Camp will open daily regardless of weather. During severe weather the campers are brought undercover. If camp needs to be closed, your Pack On Site Leader will contact you or a person designated on your son's medical form.

- **TRANSPORTATION**

Transportation to and from camp is the responsibility of the parent and/or Pack. If car pools used, BSA policy require that there be a seat belt for each Scout.

- **LUNCHESES**

Everyone attending camp must bring a lunch. Your Pack should provide a cooler to store your campers' lunches.

- **TRADING POST**

A trading post is available for snacks, cold drinks, and souvenirs.

- **THURSDAY NIGHT PROGRAM**

The family picnic begins at 6:00 Thursday and is followed by the evening program

- **ADVANCEMENT**

On the last day of camp, your Pack Leadership will receive advancement sheets listing the Achievements, Electives, and Activity badges that your scout worked on at camp. You can use it to update your son's Scout handbook.

### REGISTERING FOR CAMP

Your Scout should register for Day Camp through your Pack Day Camp Coordinator. The full fee and the Day Camp Health Summary must accompany registration.

### REFUND POLICY

Because supplies are ordered early to insure delivery, no refunds will be issued without sufficient cause (illness/injury, summer school, etc.). Refund request must be submitted in writing to the Camp Director and will be acted upon after the Camp Season is over.

### PARENT ACCOMPANIMENT

BSA requires at least two adults to accompany, assist, and supervise every ten or fewer scouts. If you Pack is sending both a group of Tiger Cubs and Cub Scouts and a group of Webelos Scouts one adult must accompany, assist and supervise each group.

### DISCIPLINE

Discipline is a Pack responsibility. A disruptive Scout will be verbally warned to improve his behavior by the accompanying adults. If the Scout fails to improve his behavior, the Camp Director will take appropriate action. This could include calling the Scouts parents to remove their son from camp.

### SIBLING TAG-A-LONGS

The accompanying adults may bring brothers and sisters of the camper to camp. These sibling must remain with the parent and the campers group. There is not a separate program for them and they will not be able to participate in the Day Camp program.

### ITEMS NOT ALLOWED IN CAMP
